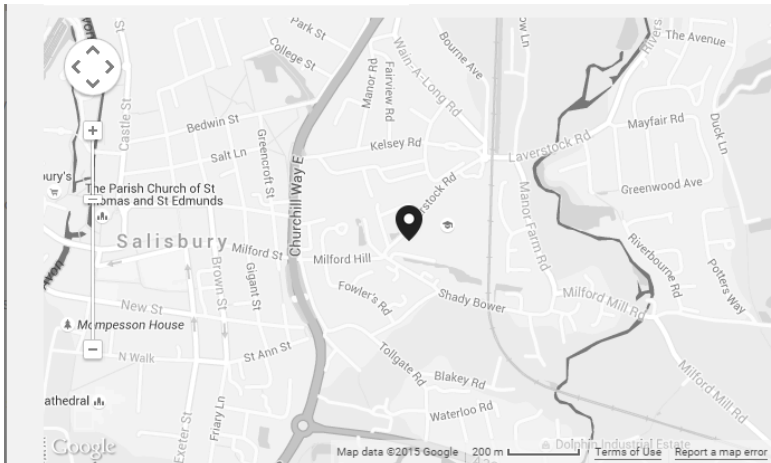


Our website gives you a taste of what we are like, but coming to see for yourself is by far the best way to discover what we are about.



Directions: By Car

At St Marks roundabout take the exit onto Wain A Long Road (signposted Laverstock). Proceed down this road (there are lots of parked cars and you may have to give way to oncoming traffic). At the bottom of the road turn right. At the mini round about turn right up the hill past Godolphin Prep. The entrance for The Godolphin School is on your left at the top of the hill. There is plenty of parking on site.

If your child does not settle, the team will come and get you (it is very rare that this happens). Children are brought back into the main hall at 12.00 to be signed out.

What is the music like?

Our worship is led by a live band. The songs are a mixture of both upbeat and more intimate songs of worship and we sing them back to back. Everyone worships in their own unique way – for some that means singing, clapping, and raising their hands; for others it means quietly reflecting on the words. We project the words onto a screen so you can join in if you want to. There is no pressure on anyone to express their worship in a particular way but many people visiting for the first time find it deeply moving.

What about the talk?

Each week there is a talk that is based on the bible. It is relevant, straightforward and inspiring. The goal is to help you grow in your relationship with Jesus and to live the “with-God” life more effectively. Often people will say that it felt as if the talk had been given just for them.

What if I am not sure what I believe?

That’s ok. Many of us were there once upon a time. We know that it can take time to get your head round things. Our commitment to you is that we will be there to answer your questions as best we can and do so in such a way that you do not feel pressured to make a commitment until you are ready.

What kind of people go?

This is a hard question. If you came on any given Sunday you might find yourself sat next to a single mum, or a company director. Behind you there might be a family that have just moved to the area and next to them a couple who were both born in Salisbury and have lived their whole lives here.
